+ 100 Hail Mary Prayers for Those Who are Sick in our Parish or Need Special Prayers

~100 Hail Mary prayers are offered up for our parishioners and family and friends dealing with serious illness. Students and staff can submit names of people who need special prayers. As a school, we each say two Hail Mary prayers at morning prayer and see their name on a special paper with a poem that gets sent to the person we are praying for.

+Pray 365 Fundraiser introduced—Anyone can buy a day on a year calendar and the students and staff pray for them on their day.

+All Saint's Day Celebration—Students and staff were encouraged to dress as a saint instead of Halloween costumes for our annual "Halloween Party".

Curriculum and Instruction– Teaching and Learning

- \Rightarrow Updated the Social Studies Curriculum and ordered a new Social series to implement next year.
- Each year the teachers update the curriculum handbook to reflect the
- academic rigors of our school and to reflect our needs from previous ITBS scores.
 There is an in-depth review of certain subject areas and update of those subject
- area textbooks completed once every 7 years.
- ⇒ Implemented Our Policy for the Ongoing Process of Reviewing and Updating our Curriculum and Textbooks.
- Each year the faculty works hard to keep to this review process in order to keep current with the best academics we can offer our students.
- \Rightarrow Received 4 more iPads for the classrooms to go along with the 11 we got last year.
- $\Rightarrow~$ Updated the computer lab with 18 new computers from MN Computers for School.
- $\Rightarrow~$ Ordered 30 Chromebooks and a traveling cart for next school year.
- $\Rightarrow~$ Had 5 students win a personal laptop through an essay contest that K-6 participated in. ~
- \Rightarrow Library Updates
 - Continued to update the library and classroom libraries (with new books) with the funds earned through our Scholastic Book Fair during Catholic Schools Week.
- \Rightarrow AR Goals and incentives
 - Our students quizzed on 2,178 books for a total of 12,406,331 words.
 - 2,195.7 points were earned throughout the school year.
 - Used AR reward system for AR points achieved for Grades 1-6.
 - Kindergarten uses their own rewards system for reading logs.
 - Classrooms implemented incentives programs for AR achievements.
 - ♦ Summer AR program started in June. Student can earn a summer
 - reading patch if they reach 10 AR points this June & July.
- \Rightarrow Professional Development
 - Staff participated in the Diocesan Faith Formation Days in September in Sleepy Eye.
 - Faculty participated in the Annual Area Faith Community's retreat day in January at Holy Redeemer in Marshall. Topic discussed were on ELL and on Mental Health titled "Troubled or Typical".

Learner Performance—Academic Gauge

Standardized Assessments – Iowa Testing of Basic Skills (ITBS)

St. Peter's School uses the ITBS for its standardize testing assessment. ITBS is a "norm-referencing" test that compares a student's performance to others who have taken the same test under the same conditions.

Grades K-6 are tested in the spring of each school year. Individual results for each student were sent home to parents. The graph on the following page shows the class average National Percentile Rank for St. Peter's students Kindergarten through 6th grade. It is compared to the average 50 percentile rank. Our goal is to have all classes over the 50 percentile rank.










Learner Performance—Academic Gauge (cont.) ITBS Test Results for St. Peter's School



National Percentile Rank is based on the national norms—50% is the average range

- Science and Social Studies are taught together in a classroom which means the information tested could have been taught last school year or will be taught next school year.
- Kindergarten does not test in Social Studies or Science.
- All but 3 categories met the 50% or higher throughout all the classes. All complete composite scores for each grade ranged from 54%—90%.

Results Summary by Grade Equivalent

Grade Equivalent means that our students have mastered content that places them academically in the number grade and the month of the school year. Below are the average GE for Language Totals, Math Totals, and a Complete Composite total for each grade. The Social and Science GE totals area included for grades 1-6 as they do not test in these areas.

 reading teacher; continue to recruit preschool/kindergarten families who are still undecided.













School Financial Summary



Actual Numbers as of June 9, 2016



- The school continues to rely on our fundraising efforts to contribute the budget and overall functions of the school.
 - Marathon—We met our goal of \$46,000! Thanks to all who supported the students in pledges!
 - The Catholic United Financial School Raffle was a huge success even with our goal of \$20,000 and our actual amount raised at \$14,445.
- Tuition will increase \$50 per student next year. It will be at \$1400 for 1 student families, \$2000 for 2 student families, and \$2500 for 3+ student families. Preschool tuition will also increase to \$600 with an additional day added for preschool.
- St. Peter's School was blessed with private donations from parishioners and also by memorials given to the school after loved ones passed away. A large portion of this was designated for technology and will be used to purchase 30 Chromebooks for next year.
- PRAY365 was a new fundraiser introduced this year and brought in more than budgeted.

School Strategic Plan (SSP) – The Vehicle to Our Future

A driving force behind major projects and updates to the school is the School Strategic Plan (SSP) created when we became accredited with MNSAA. This Plan gives the structure by which we continue to thrive, grow, and be held accountable in that growth. The main goal is to always provide the very best Catholic education to our students so they can have a safe and nurturing environment to grow into their best selves.

As a school, we are always looking for new and exciting ways to involve the parish community in our school. One great was with a new fundraiser PRAY365. With this fundraiser, people were able to "purchase" a day throughout the year to have the school and staff pray for them. In return, they would donate the given amount for the day which corresponds to the day of the year that it is. The school students and staff pray for these intentions at morning prayer throughout the year.

Another area that was fulfilled on the SSP was in Objective 1. A new security system with a door lock feature was installed during the summer. Keycards were distributed to staff and members of the parish who needed regular access to the school on weekends and nights (parish organizations). This new system adds a little piece of security during our school day as any visitors need to buzz in to get into the school.

With our growing and successful preschool program, we were approved to hire a new co-preschool teacher who will also teach 1st grade reading along with social studies for grades K-4. We are excited to have Natalie (Giese) Delmonico join our staff next year. We will also be rearranging classrooms to create a preschool room to be shared with preschool and kindergarten.

It has been an eventful, trying, and exciting year at St. Peter's School. The students have shown growth academically and spiritually. The staff and students came together to support another staff member in a time of need.
